This total would not be possible without our many hole sponsors. Five of our very own Knights deserve special thanks in sponsoring a hole for our tournament - Scott (& Peggy) Johnson, John Lawson, James Lehman, Bill Oertli, and Duane Price. Special Thanks also goes to Mike Madden's wife Sue who also sponsors a hole at our tournament. 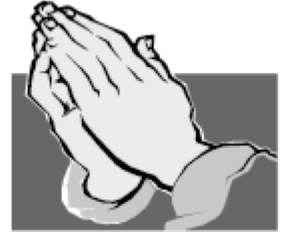
