District Reports

Field Agent Report – Steve Winkels

- KC financial products are doing well.
- If you need an IRA call Steve. Currently going at 3% to 3.5 %
- Life insurance, 9% dividend on whole life with a 4.5% guarantee
- The Knights will surpass 5 billion in life insurance this past year.
- Currently the Knights would rank as the 941st largest company overall in the US

District Deputy Report – Berry Hobbs

- Council 11460 is doing a good job as a council. Berry will attend our meeting when needed as he has other more pressing needs within his district.
- There is some interest in beginning a Squires group at Lourdes. Berry has met with Denny Nigon (Principal at Lourdes) and they are interested. Will need plenty of Knights to offer support and sponsorship. This will be a great feeder system into all councils. Will look into reactivating an inactive 1013 Squires council number.
- Berry will be attending the mid winter meetings Jan. 9th - 11th. State Deputy Willard Strand is asking all councils to get their paper work in on time.
- Berry will be holding two district meetings per year. The first will be on Jan 17th from 10 to 2 for training of Grand Knights, Deputy Grand Knights, and Financial Secretaries. Lunch will be provided.
- Berry discussed the free throw contest. Local competitions do not require medals/trophies. District winners will receive a medal, and region winners will get a trophy. District will be at Lourdes old gym from 1 - 3 on February 8th, and regions at Lourdes old gym from 1 - 3 on February 22nd.
- February 6th will be the 6th annual RCS Catholic Scholarship Banquet. Bill Lower, director of development at Lourdes, will be heading up this effort. Cost will be \$100.00 per couple and \$500.00 per table.
- State convention meeting will be held Tuesday Dec. 9th. Jeff Bagniewski will be heading up registration and would like our information. There will also be a meeting January 14th, 7:00 at the KC Hall. It was determined that the State staff handles the convention minutes and that the local council will hire the stenographer.
- Fr. T along with Deacon Mangun (Asst. Chaplain at 1013) will have a day of reflection at St. Francis on March 6th. More information to follow. He is very interested in the spirituality of the council.
- 1013 wants to begin weekly fish fries. They need the Resurrection council and 11460 to take one Friday a month to make this work. This is a good way to make money. Dick Witzke is the 1013 contact. You could have various ministries sign up to help and split the profits. Similar to what is done with pancake breakfasts. The fish fries need to be staffed from 4:30 to 8:00 with a serving time of 5:00 to 7:30. Councils will receive \$2.50 per plate up to 300 plates, and \$3.00 per plate if more than 300 people attend.
- Membership - Needs information on all new members starting from July 1st of 2003. Send copies to Phil Harter and Berry Hobbs. After each first degree this information also needs to be sent in. We must get our membership from first degree to third degree. The next major degree is April 4th at Lourdes. There will be a major degree in Faribault on February 8th.
