## Little Known Saint of the Month

*Dave Dykstal*

Saint Bernard Latini lived from 1605 to 1667 in Corleone, Sicily. He was a shoemaker by trade, but was also considered to be one of the most expert swordsmen and duelists of his day. As such he had several brushes with the law. After mortally wounding a police officer and seeking sanctuary in a church in Palermo, he experienced a true conversion. He became a Capuchin lay brother taking the name Bernard at that time. He lived an extremely austere life to make up for the ways of his youth and is known for his supernatural gifts of the healing of animals, prophecies, ecstasies, and levitation.

He was canonized by Pope John Paul II on June 10, 2001. His memorial is on January 12th.
