## Saint of the Month

This month we go way back in time to the beginning of the Church where we find Pope Saint Anacletus, who was (perhaps) the second successor to Saint Peter. Here is one version of his story.

Anacletus was converted to the faith, ordained a deacon, and consecrated a priest by Saint Peter himself. He was born in Athens and in the year 83 he was chosen to succeed Pope Saint Cletus, who had been martyred. (This appears to be one of the major points of debate, Anacletus and Cletus are sometimes said to be the same person.) During his nine years of reign, he was able to consecrate six bishops. The last of these was Saint Evaristus, who would succeed him; Saint Anacletus consecrated him the year before his death, foreseeing he could not long escape the fate of all the first Vicars of Christ.

One of his enduring ordinances was the law that for the consecration of a bishop, three bishops must participate; a practice that had been established by Saint Paul. He also required that all ordinations be done in public. He built a church in honor of Saint Peter, to whom he owed his conversion, at the site of Saint Peter's burial. He reserved burial sites for future martyrs in the Christian cemeteries, because multitudes were being condemned under Emperor Domitian. He also designated and adorned sites for the interment of future Pontiffs in the Vatican. He died on July 13th in the year 96, and was buried in the Vatican. His feast is, appropriately, on July 13th.

No Form 100s were read.

### Officers Reports
