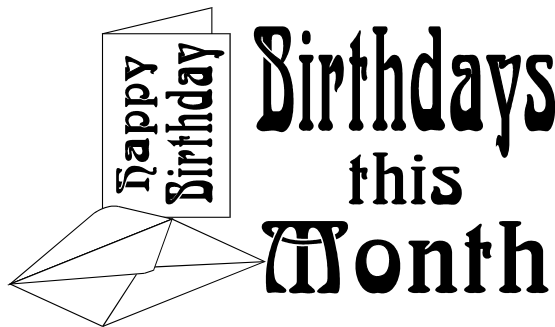

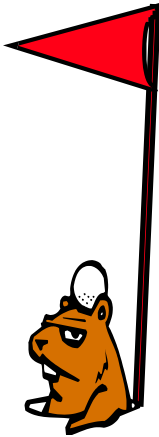

Little Known Saint of the Month

Getting tired of European saints? Let's move further east, Far East to be specific, where we meet Lorenzo Ruiz.

Lorenzo was born in Manila around 1600 of a Chinese father and a Filipino mother. Both were Christians. As a child he learned both Chinese and Tagalog. He served as an altar boy and sacristan to the local Dominicans and from them learned Spanish. He became a professional calligrapher. He became a full member of the Confraternity of the Holy Rosary. He married and had two sons and a daughter. All in all, a normal Catholic family man of his time.

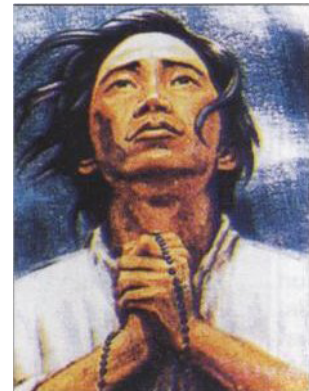
His life took an abrupt turn when he was accused of murder. He was given an offer to escape the Philippines and to sail to Japan with Dominican missionaries. Japan was a dangerous place at the time because of severe persecution of Christians.

They landed at Okinawa and Lorenzo could have gone on to Formosa, but decided to remain with his priest companions. They were soon found out, arrested and taken to Nagasaki. There they were subjected to unspeakable torture: huge quantities of water were forced down their throats and they were made to lie down. Long boards were then placed on their stomachs and guards then stepped on the ends of the boards, forcing the water to spurt violently from mouth, nose and ears.

The superior soon died. Lorenzo was offered freedom if he renounced his faith. His response? "I am a Catholic and I wholeheartedly accept to die for God. If I have a thousand lives to offer, I will offer them all up to Him." He and the others were then hung upside down in pits. Boards fitted with semicircular holes were fitted around their waists and stones put on top to increase the pressure. They were tightly bound, to slow circulation and prevent a speedy death. They were allowed to hang for three days. By that time Lorenzo and one of the others was dead. The remaining members of the party were beheaded.

Pope John Paul II canonized Lorenzo, his 5 companions, and 10 others, Asians and Europeans, men and women, who spread the faith in the Philippines, Formosa and Japan. Lorenzo Ruiz is the first canonized Filipino martyr.

We celebrate his life on September 28th.

Lecturer Program – Instead of a Lecturer program, Drew Majewski presented a proposal for funding of his Eagle Scout Award project. His project involves landscaping a portion of the Holy Spirit Church grounds. Total project is \$5000 with mulch being provided by Hathaway's and labor of \$2500 being provided by volunteers. He has also indicated that many of the trees, shrubs and prairie grasses will be provided at discounted prices. He is planning on completing the project on September 6th. He is looking for donations to total \$900 to complete the project.

Youth Director – Paul Daley: Arrangements have been made to hold the Soccer Challenge earlier during the Founder's Day Picnic. Paul will work with Dan Kennedy and Mary Nowakowski on the Youth Ministry Appreciation Event. Joe O'Toole provided information on the Youth Ministry Appreciation Event. Due to Mary's time commitment, we as Knights need to organize it. It was mentioned that we may want to consider a cookout with games and movies at the end of September or early October.
